I am interested in joining the Board of Trustees because I think I would bring some special strengths and because I would like to become more closely involved with ISB, where my children have already spent over 5 years. My wife and I hope to see them graduate from ISB and therefore would like to be more closely involved with the school.

I am currently working for the Food and Agriculture Organization of the UN as Policy Officer in the Asia-Pacific regional office. I have nearly 20 years of experience working on economic issues and economic research for the United Nations, the International Food Policy Research Institute, Washington D.C. and the National Council for Applied Economic Research, New-Delhi, India. I have taught Economics and Statistics and have acted as Adviser to the Government of Malawi's National Statistical Office. In my present job I provide advice on economic policy and development policy to the countries of this region.

My experience of living and working in eight countries in four continents has given me a broad perspective and made it easy for me to work with people of all nationalities and backgrounds. Secondly, my very extensive experience in conducting economic analysis and providing policy advice to governments and other entities will, I am sure, be very helpful to the Board of Trustees.

The Board of Trustees should provide overall strategic guidance to the school administration, drawing on the experience and knowledge of its members, without interfering in the day to day running of the school. I see the role of the Board as akin to that of a constitutional monarch: it has the right to be consulted, the right to encourage and the right to warn.

ISB has already built a sterling reputation. Over the next 10 years it should consolidate those gains while advancing in new directions. In my view, the most pressing need is to help students develop qualities of intellectual curiosity, initiative and creativity so that they become lifelong learners, who can think outside the box. The wide variety of nationalities and backgrounds possessed by our students are a real asset on which the school can build.
