As members of the ISA, parents at ISB are in a unique position to play an important part in determining the strategic direction of the school. With our children's education being one of the most important investments we'll ever make, I would like to make the most of the opportunity of being re-elected a Board member to ensure that our children receive one of the best educations in the world.

Serving on the Board for the past four years as Treasurer and Chairman has been immensely fulfilling, especially since ISB has continued to improve in many areas of the school.
