Seeks a 'School Health Coordinator'

The Position

Reporting to the Director of Risk Management, the School Health Coordinator shall be responsible for the coordination and implementation of preventive health services and crisis response at ISB. The School Health Coordinator works to promote the health and safety of ISB students and staff, including health promotion and advocacy, staff training and communication to the ISB community, and working with the Head Nurse in managing Health Clinic processes and response. The School Health Coordinator also works closely with the Director of Risk Management to implement, update and establish school health and safety policies in support of ISB's mission and vision.

POSITION SUMMARY

The School Health Coordinator responsibilities shall include but will not be limited to:

- Identifying and treating health disorders
- Providing instruction and communication regarding the maintenance of good health and disease prevention,
- Assisting clinical staff in evaluating the physical condition of students and staff and referring them to appropriate facilities as necessary,
- Implementing new directives and policies, planning and implementing changes to improve service delivery,
- Attending committee meetings and delivering presentations as required,
- Attending post-incident response sessions and evaluating clinic staff's incident response.
- Reviewing student health concerns prior to trips off campus and reviewing medical packages for each trip

POSITION DUTIES

Advocates for student and staff health and wellness by:

- Researching health related topics and offering resources to students, staff and families
- Working to ensure quality of care delivery for staff during hospitalization and emergency care
- Using evidence-based literature, communicates recent and pertinent health information to staff

Promotes and maintains emergency preparedness by:

- Working with Director of Risk Management to ensure the Emergency Crisis Response Manual follows best practices and current ISB needs
- Planning for the prevention, response and post-response aspects of possible emergencies.
- Teaching First Aid/CPR/AED training classes for school staff and others
- Planning and conducting emergency response drills

Assists Health Clinic Staff to provide emergency care for ill and injured students and staff by:

- Assisting Health Clinic staff as needed to provide care and first aid to students and staff who are ill or injured during school hours.
- Managing major medical emergencies in the office and on campus during office hours.
- Supervising the administration of emergency medication, nebulizer treatments, oxygen etc.
- Supervising the administration of emergency medication provided by the parent.
- Be available to staff after hours to assist in medical emergencies or situations where there is a major health concern
- Advocate for staff with health concerns and attend appointments with them if requested

Creates and maintains policies and procedures related to school health issues by:

- Updating the appropriate sections of the Emergency Crisis Response Manual.
- Updating of communicable diseases policy, health delivery protocols and design of other health policy as needed
- Designing and implementing new forms and assessment tools as required.
- Auditing Staff CPR Certification Status

Promotes maintenance of public health and safety and health standards to prevent illness, injury, or spread of communicable disease by:

- Monitoring campus accidents and taking appropriate action.
- Coordinating with other student supports and division heads as needed
- Monitoring injury / incident reports.
- In conjunction with local staff and Thai Ministry of Health authorities, surveying ISB staff, students and community for outbreaks of communicable disease.

Provides health education and guidance to students, staff, and the ISB community by:

- Providing annual staff orientation regarding school health issues and first aid training
- Assisting health teachers, counselors and psychologists as requested
- Presenting health related issues to students in the classroom setting
- Communicating health related information relating to Thailand and ISB community as seasons and outbreaks of communicable disease dictate

Required Skills

- Effective communication skills
- Excellent problem solving skills
- Approaches health as balance of physical, mental and emotional well-being
- Leadership qualities including vision for school health
- Project management skills
- Excellent clinical skills
- Utilizes community resources

Qualifications

- Degree in Nursing (RN, BSN, or similar qualification)
- Current Nursing license
- Current CPR certification

- Wilderness First Aid and/or Wilderness First Responder certification is preferred (or similar certification)
- Additional qualification in Health Administration or Advanced Medical Training will be preferred.

History

Founded in 1951, ISB was the first international school in the Kingdom of Thailand. The school initially opened on the grounds of the US Embassy with 35 students, but with increasing enrollment moved to different campuses in the Bangkok area. Enrollment reached 3,650 students during the Vietnam War. In 1992, ISB moved to its present 35 acre purpose-built campus, 25 km

from the center of Bangkok. 1,940 students are currently enrolled in the Elementary, Middle, and High schools.

Community

ISB is proudly international in its student body, enrolling students from more than sixty countries. Students from the United States account for 32% of enrollment, with students from Thailand (20%), Japan (8%), and Korea (7%) forming other major nationality groups. English is a second or third language for more than half of the students.

Academic Program

ISB provides a university preparatory program with English as the language of instruction. Graduates earn a U.S. high school diploma and most students elect to pursue the International Baccalaureate Diploma program.

Inclusion

Our school is part of the **Next Frontier Inclusion** network of schools. This signifies our unwavering commitment to develop our capacity to support more diverse learning needs. Therefore, we are seeking educators that not only embrace inclusion as a concept but successfully adjust their teaching to meet the needs of their students. This includes students who need a higher level of challenge as well as those who require more support or a different approach to their learning.

Student Safeguarding

Safeguarding is a priority at ISB. Our Student Safeguarding Policy outlines the measures we take to create a safe and nurturing environment for all of the children we come into contact with in our work, as well as the procedures we use to ensure that we fulfill our professional and ethical obligation to identify children who are in need of help and protection and to take appropriate action to ensure their wellbeing. Faculty

The Pre-K to 12 faculty consists of some 220 teachers including 3 librarians, 11 counselors, 2 psychologists, learning coaches and 11 special education teachers. Each of the school's three divisions has a principal and one or more assistant principals. There is also a Head of School, a Deputy Head of Learning, and a Deputy Head of School/Chief Financial Officer.
